

## **Regular Transport Risk Assessment**

## Transporting children to the bus stop in before school care

This risk assessment supports the safety and wellbeing of children travelling to the bus stop on foot, escorted by educators, on each occasion when they attend in before school care. This constitutes regular transport, as defined in the Education and Care Services National Regulations. Service providers, nominated supervisors and educators need to take specific steps to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of children. Under the Education and Care Services National Regulations (r 102B), a transport risk assessment must be conducted before an education and care service transports a child/children (other than as part of an excursion\*).

Note: A risk assessment is only required to be completed at least once for a 12 month period if it is 'regular transportation\*\*'.

This risk assessment will be updated at least annually and following a serious incident involving the before school care journey to the bus stops, as part of a process of assessing the risks and taking steps to improve safety for children.

- \* Regulation 101 includes the minimum risk assessment considerations for excursions by approved providers, nominated supervisors and family day care educators. This includes specific considerations when an excursion involves transporting children.
- \*\* Regular transportation is transport by the service or arranged by the service (other than as part of an excursion) of a child being educated and cared for by the service, where the circumstances relevant to a risk assessment are substantially the same each time the child is transported. [An example of a change in circumstances that are substantially different might be when the means of transport or the transportation route or destination(s) have altered or the provider of the transportation service has changed.]

All route changes are accounted for.

(include how each child's wellbeing is safely accounted for)	One educator will complete a face-to-name check against the checklist (on paper or via the portal accessed on a mobile phone) before setting out from the premises. The list of children must be accurate before departing and must remain with an educator for the duration of the journey.				
	The lead educator will set out from the front gate with an educator at the front of the group. Children will be instructed to remain behind the educator at all times. If 2 educators are present, the other educator will remain at the rear.				
	The lead educator will stop at all roads, driveways and pedestrian crossings to ensure the group is together before proceeding. At each stop the lead educator will do a head count.				
Describe the procedures for embarking the vehicle: (include how each child is accounted for in embarking)	When the bus arrives to collect the children, the lead educator will instruct the children to line up at the silver communications pole, a distance of approx. 2 metres from the edge of the road with an educator at the head of the line.  When the bus stops, the educator will guide the children onto the bus and mark them off on the roll via the online portal.  When all children on the list are on the bus, the educator(s) can return to the service and/or complete their duties for the session.
